Blake was driving on a suspended license and pleads for his wife to take the fall. Chasey worried after seeing the wreckage about the "what if's" that could have arisen.

"Messenger" a tale of rumors and truths that can be spread through a simple chat app. Nikki and her four friends are fighting over things that were said on a messaging app. Nikki, comes to truth with growing up and how hard it is to have untruths said about her. After confronting her accuser, she finds out how strong she can really be on her own.

"Teen Mom" is a personal narrative about the author herself. Finding she was going to be a teen mom and not wanting to be a statistic. Eva shares her slant on when she found out she was pregnant with her child and how she still achieved what she wanted.

"The Fight" is a tale of an argument between a husband and wife. This tale shares that just because something is stressful that it isn't always right to call it quits. Devan and Fiona a husband and wife of six years are fighting over something trivial. Fiona has Borderline personality disorder and sometimes pushes the envelope. While Devan suffers from Bi polar disorder. The two argue and one leaves. The one who leaves does some soul-searching finding that there is only one true thing they want.
